Executive Summary

Beecher Hills, Lionel Hampton, Cativo Properties Park Visioning

The Beecher/Hampton Visioning Process began in July of 2006. After a series of organizational meetings, five public meetings, door-to-door surveys, presence at two festivals, the community and Park Pride developed a Conceptual Master Plan to guide future improvements in the nature preserve. The Conceptual Master Plan includes an illustrated master plan, a list of prioritized projects with order-of-magnitude costs, and record of the public involvement process that was followed. Those records are collected in this document.

Throughout the public involvement process, it was clearly reiterated that the natural aspects of the site are important to this neighborhood. Education, hiking, community gathering space, playgrounds, activities for all age groups, and bicycling are important activities that the community want the site to support in an ecologically-sensitive manner. The site includes some of the most archeologically significant Civil War trenches in the region. These ruins need to be preserved while serving as an educational tool for the public.


During the course of the public involvement program, the community proved its ability to coordinate projects in the Beecher/Hampton nature preserve. Community members were integrally involved in the public involvement process. The community has strong leaders that are dedicated to the preservation and improvement of this property. The property was acquired recently by the City of Atlanta and was spurred by the neighbors who recognized the unique opportunities of this site as one of the largest undeveloped natural areas in the City. This savvy community has a proven track record of success in guiding their destiny and organizing around significant projects.

The Conceptual Master Plan is presented in this document. The community widely supported this plan and is eager to begin implementation. There is flexibility in the prioritized list. The community recognizes that priorities will be determined in part by available funding and restrictions that accompany those funds. Each project included herein has substantial community support and will contribute in some ways to the health, safety, and quality of life of the local neighbors and regional Atlanta community.


Lionel Hampton / Beecher Hills Nature Center, Park Pride Visioning Plan, 2006





