### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The East Side Greenways Visioning project began with the receipt of applications from the Friends of Gilliam Park, J.C. Reynolds Park, Coan Park, Walker Park, East Lake Park\*, and Bessie Branham Park\*\*. Three communities that comprise NPU-O were seeking help organizing a planning effort for their neighborhood parks. Upon reviewing the applications, Park Pride decided to approach all parks in NUP-O as one planning process and include connectivity between the three neighborhoods and their parks and the City's network of alternative transportation.

This planning efforts includes all parks within the neighborhoods of:

- East Lake
- Kirkwood
- Edgewood

#### The parks included:

- East Lake Park (see 2005 plan)
- Gilliam Park
- Coan Park
- Reverend J.C. Reynolds Park
- Walker Park
- Vacant properties that were identified as potential greenspace during the planning process

The Steering Committee comprised several committed community leaders from the three neighborhoods. The Committee met monthly to discuss how to engage the wider community and to make decisions based on community input from both surveys and at meetings. The committee originally scheduled five public meetings:

- Guided Tour, May 21, 2008
- Visioning Meeting, May 21, 2008
- Design Workshop, June 14, 2008
- Preliminary Design Review, July 12, 2008
- Final Design Review and Prioritization Meeting, September 6, 2008

During the Visioning process, it was noted that the first two meetings had very poor turn-out from the Edgewood neighborhood. Plans were made to host a supplemental design workshop in the Edgewood neighborhood for: Saturday, June 28th. This meeting was a huge success and involved over twenty Edgewood neighbors who were grateful for the additional opportunity to participate.

The Committee also made self-directed tours available through a map and guide of the potential greenspaces in the NPU. Park Pride helped the Committee develop a survey which the Committee utilized at neighborhood meetings, NUP meetings, and neighborhood events.


The plan included herein is meant to serve as a documentation of the community's agreed projects and priorities for NPU-O. The graphic plan illustrates concepts and is not considered to be a set of construction documents. It will take cooperation from the City, the neighbors, and the greater Atlanta community to construct all the changes in and between the parks. The Steering Committee will serve an ongoing role in spearheading the changes to the park, finding funding sources, and overseeing project development. Park Pride will continue to serve as a liason between the community and potential funding sources, including the City of Atlanta. It is expected that the entire build-out of the improvements proposed for the proposed and existing greenspaces in NUP-O will take years, if not decades to complete. The first step, determining the best ways to improve greenspace in NPU-O is completed and another chapter in its redevelopment can begin.





Park Pride is a nonprofit group that leads and inspires action for parks and greenspace. In 2006, we coordinated over 20,000 hours of volunteer work in Atlanta parks, developed new conceptual master plans for 5 parks, helped start over a dozen friends of the park groups, and led the successful charge to have the Fulton County Board of Commission reverse its decision to sell six Sandy Springs Parks to the highest bidder. Park Pride continued

to work with community organizations and grassroot advocates to support the creation of the Atlanta BeltLine, which will create more than 1,000 acres of new parks and 33 miles of trails. Our annual conference serves as the signature event in our work to create a world class park system in Atlanta.





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
